From the General Secretary

Dear Servant of the Lord:

Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

I am very thankful for the National Convention in London this year. Thank-you for acclaiming Anna Mae and I to continue to serve as General Secretary. We request your continued prayers.

GOD'S HEDGE

Job 1: 9, 10 “Does Job fear God for nothing?’ Satan replied, ‘Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has?’”

Of Satan Jesus said, “When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies.” John 8: 44 NIV. Yet a pearl may sometimes be found in the mouth of a swine and truth in the mouth of the Devil.

Our text is one of God’s precious pearls in the mouth of a swine, truth in the mouth of the Devil. God did not dispute Satan’s statement that he had set a hedge about Job and all he owned. Moreover, God proceeded to show that his hedge around Job was higher and stronger than even Satan had imagined. This is one the overlooked lessons of Job.

God has placed a hedge about his own. Yes, even you – Servant of the Lord. What significance does this fact have for us? Consider this from two points of view: God’s and that of the Christian/Servant of the Lord.

WHAT SUGGESTIONS DOES GOD’S HEDGE ABOUT US MAKE?

- A. PROPRIETORSHIP. God’s hedge around us suggests that he owns us. No honest man/woman would put a fence around another’s property. God created us and redeemed us. When, in response to God ‘s Word, “I have redeemed you.” Isaiah 43: 1 NIV, we reply, “You have redeemed me,” the pact is sealed. He owns us, we have recognized his right to ownership. We have said yes, to his call upon our lives.

- B. PRECIOUSNESS. There are millions of unfenced acres in Canada, wastelands not worth a fence. But fertile fields have a fence around them. We sing, “So precious is Jesus, my Saviour, my King.” The other side of that coin is that we are precious to him.
- C. PROTECTION. A good fence protects a crop against its enemies. Satan walked around Job and found that hedge impregnable until God conditionally opened the gate and let him in. No anxious mother watches over her baby more carefully than Jesus over his own. Psalm 34: 7 “The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear him, and delivereth them.” KJV.
- D. Purpose. God’s hedge is not merely for the sake of protection. He also wants to plan and cultivate his field. 1 Corinthians 3: 9 “For we are labourers together with God: ye are God’s husbandry, we are God’s building.”

WHAT OUGHT TO CHARACTERIZE THOSE AROUND WHOM GOD HAS PLACED HIS HEDGE?

- A. SEPARATION. Jesus told his disciples, “You do not belong to the world ... That is why the world hates you.” John 15: 19 NIV. He also said, “My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one.” John 17: 15 NIV
- B. USEFULNESS. Jesus shows how we are to do this by two striking figures of speech.
 1. “You are the salt of the earth.” Matthew 5: 13 NIV. The function of salt is to flavor, to preserve, to create thirst.
 2. “You are the light of the world.” Matthew 5: 14 NIV. The function of light is to illumine, to give life and health and direction.
- C. FRUITFULNESS. One should expect more from a fenced field. Abandon an orchard. Take down the fence. It will soon cease to bear fruit; and what it does bear thieves will steal.
- D. ENDURANCE. James writes, “You have heard of Job’s perseverance.” James 5: 11 NIV. The word here does not mean patience in the sense of waiting for something to happen. It means patience in the sense of being able to endure, to keep on going in the face of disappointment, frustration, suffering, and defeat.

Dear Servant of the Lord, may God help us, who are God’s precious and protected possession to carry out his purpose for us! God help us to keep ourselves separate from the world, useful, and fruitful. God help us to endure, to keep on keeping on.

URGENT: IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED

A historic Pentecostal/Charismatic Churches of North America meeting was held in Federal Way, Washington.

Pentecostal and Charismatic denominational leaders rallied in unity to a world-shaking vision! God spoke; we listened. His Church is arising. So boldly did PCCNA members speak that now – before we even get started – nationally respected ministry partners are expressing interest in collaborating with our vision.

BACKGROUND:

Rev. Dr. Jeff Farmer (Chairman of PCCNA) has been praying for 45 years that the Lord would allow this planet to see a united Church speak with such decisive resolve (on a simple, uncomplicated issue of His own choosing) that the world would stand in awe, recognizing the power of our living God and the compassionate heart of His warrior Bride.

In a moment of quickening, God spoke to Dr. Farmer last July from Psalm 91 about “the terror of night” and “the pestilence that stalks at darkness.” He did not know then, as he does now, the demon of malaria is carried by a night predator – a mosquito whose lethal injection in the darkness of night kills a child every 40 seconds...2,000 people every day. He did not know we eliminated malaria in the USA in the early 1950s, but did not extend our knowledge and resources to vulnerable, poverty laden people in Africa and elsewhere. He did not know malaria is 100% preventable. He did not know World Vision US was already mobilized to engage this battle. Dr. Farmer did not know they were praying and asking God for a “David” to come forth and level the final death blow to this Goliath. He did not know a \$6 pesticide treated bed net could protect and save the lives of two children for up to four years. And so, today, 2,000 more will die...until some acts.

ACTION TAKEN:

Government, business, and science are fighting malaria. They have slowly gained ground, but in this economy their resources are dwindling. Meantime the faith community...the Church...has been too silent. Today, the vision to end malaria by 2015 awaits bold leadership – it awaits people of faith.

Your PCCNA colleagues heard God’s call and acted with bold faith. With unanimous consent they passed this motion: “MOTION PREVAILED that PCCNA enter into a strategic partnership with World Vision to end malaria. Denominations, denominational churches, local churches, and para-church organizations that are a part of PCCNA are encouraged to develop their own strategies for partnership with PCCNA and World Vision in this effort.”

History will remember a day when the final child died and the war against malaria ended...when the saving of millions of lives was triggered because PCCNA stepped into the ring. ***“Demonstrate unity in the power of the Spirit.”***

I would like to identify churches/ministries willing to participate in a “pilot/test” campaign in the fall of this year. World Vision will supply the resources for the local churches/ministries.

At the I. A. O. G. I. (Canada) AGM, a motion from the floor donated \$1,000.00 and that evening \$1,900.00 was donated. Thank-you. I. A. O. G. I. (Canada) is the first Canadian Pentecostal/Charismatic Fellowship to respond.

The power of this miracle is that we all act together: One Church. One Voice. One Vision.

While I was in Haiti right before Easter, we had a wonderful Pastors and leaders conference and also on the last day brought their wives to a Hotel in Port au Prince for a special marriage seminar! The majority of these Pastors and wives had never set foot inside a hotel or restaurant

Its great to see how many people have come to Christ in the past year but we are having problems with enough space for people not only in church but who are needing to be on our programs! We do have many families connected and being trained for micro-loans through a foundation I am working with, so I hope in years to come we will see a lot of families and individuals become self-supportive! It is going well but in such a broken country it will take several years to see the results we are looking for so in the meantime they still need our help to survive!

EMERGING LEADERS AND GOING WHERE NONE HAVE GONE BEFORE

“I’m still learning” Michelangelo
“Then Herod secretly called for the wise men...” Matthew 2:7

On the last afternoon of our National Conference in London, Ontario my husband and I attended a convocation at the seminary we graduated from. An Episcopalian Bishop gave the address on “Emerging Leaders”, “Going Where None May Have Gone Before”. She brilliantly brought the audience through the journey and leadership struggles of Moses and at the end her

message left me with the image that very little manna is falling from heaven nowadays. We have bread, yet we need manna. We were astonished because her message coincided with our conference theme of “Emerging Leaders”. However, nothing is a coincidence and some themes are timeless.

Over 20 years ago a group ministry leader asked me what I wanted to be known for when I died. Caught off guard by the question I hesitated. He continued, “*What is your epitaph going to read Adelina?*” To my surprise I said “*to bring the gospel where it has never been brought before*”. There was an audible gasp in the room! “*Well isn’t this what God has called us to?*” I asked. “*Where do you think this might be, to bring the gospel where it has not been brought before?*” someone asked. I answered, “*I’ve already brought the gospel to places where it has not gone before. Now as far as the other places in the future I don’t know but God does.*”

Moses didn’t know the whole plan either when he left with the people of Israel into the wilderness. They were faced with new frontiers, new ways of eating, new ways of moving and conditions were created so that it was necessary for them to live one day at a time. What a hard concept that is for most of us today! *Basically they had ventured where none had gone before! This is a theme that consistently reoccurs in the bible from Moses to Esther to Jesus to Paul to us so while the Star Trek series may have made this notion popular it is a persistent endeavor occurring from the beginning of time.*

Part of my own epitaph then “*to bring the gospel where it has never been brought before*” can be written yet my journey in ministry is far from over. I know there places left where no one has yet brought the gospel that God has called me to specially. There are also many different ways to bring the gospel! If you aren’t sure about how or where these places might be just email me and we’ll have a conversation about where God might be leading you.

Therefore it was not a coincidence that in the same week and same city where the IAOGI had their national conference a Presbyterian Bishop spoke to graduates at an Anglican Seminary on the same theme although it was delivered in different ways! For example, as an introvert I appreciated and basked in the profound graciousness of academic preparation and artistic imagery in which the Bishop brought the gospel. Her language and presentation were in stark contrast to the more evangelical extroverted delivery of most of the speakers at the conference. However there were two very important similarities. Although there were different groups of people at both the conference and graduation the same call of God to go and preach the gospel was evident. There were also vast age spans from youth to senior. As Pastor McPhail reminded us *there is not an age limit on “Emerging Leaders”*. Isn’t this exciting news! Furthermore seasoned ministers will know when it is time to rest and hear the words, “Well done faithful one.”

When we venture with the gospel where none have gone before “*there is often shaking and stirring that happens*”. When Moses rose to the call of God in his life for example and changed his life direction whole nations were affected. When politicians like William

Wilberforce in the 1800's rose to the occasion of ending slavery it affected every nation!

There can also be danger when venturing into the new and when the old order is threatened. Call to mind the story of King Herod and the slaughter of innocents in Matthew 2: 7-23. King Herod whose spirit and soul were tortured (there is no rest for the wicked) by a new order of things to come, schemed up a plan to kill the new, the baby Jesus.

How often have church leaders throughout the ages killed the new and missed out on what God wanted to do? The "Rock and Roll" movement in the 60's for example could have been claimed by the church but Christians condemned it, alongside the musicians and missed out. Meanwhile most of the music played in churches puts me to sleep! So while it is extremely important to establish our faith and callings on sure foundations we also need to remember that rebirth, renewal and seasons of change are also part of God's plan regardless of our age and how long we have been in ministry.

The "new" often needs both time and space to come to maturity and this may mean being out of sight and earshot from the old. King Herod for example summoned the mysterious kings of the east to find out where they were going. My guess is that he was upset that they didn't come looking for him. They were looking for the new one prophesied by the ancients of old. Herod never did find Jesus! Joseph through dreams was directed to move several times to keep his family safe and we don't read anything of Jesus life pre-teen life anywhere in the gospels until he emerges again up until he is 12. *Even Jesus had a specific time to emerge.*

Note, both the Kings of the East and Mary and Joseph were told to change direction. This is important to us because there will be specific times when we will be told to "take another route" in our lives. Too many of us however hang on to the past and refuse to go into the unknown. We need to listen to caution: stay when you are told to move and you will die spiritually, emotionally and even physically!

In conclusion remember that God always has a GPS system when we venture into the "unknown". The Kings of the East after all had one provided for them when they went seeking Jesus. The earth in the days of King Herod could not relay a sign of the birth of Christ so the night skies over the universe became the parchment of heaven. Lastly, the governments of Herod do die. Jesus always emerges. In the end regardless of the battle God wins. *So don't be afraid to go where none has gone before. God already knows the way and you won't go alone!*

From the Editor

Dear Servants in Christ:

“Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected, but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me.
